The humanitarian foundation of the Church has provided basic supplies to the orphanage and school uniforms for the children. The Bina Kasih orphanage is new and has been working to find local sponsors but was badly in need of help to cover school tuition for the current school year.

The Jaredita Foundation has paid



the first year tuition for the orphans and they are extremely grateful for the help. Mrs. Mastina, who founded the orphanage said, "praise the Lord that there are good people helping us to meet the needs. The children are now able to go to school and they are healthy and studying diligently."

About the Jaredita Foundation, Inc.

The Jaredita Foundation Inc (JFI) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization named in honor of Jareditabeloved daughter of Steffi and Subandriyo. She passed away in 2007 after one year of schooling at BYU-Hawaii and just weeks before she planned to enter BYU-Provo. Jaredita had a love of learning and a love for the children of Indonesia.

The purpose of JFI is to help young Indonesian children and young adults get an education. With the help of in-country facilitators, children who are not able to attend school because their families cannot afford tuition, books and uniforms will be offered financial assistance to pay for primary and secondary schooling. Payments are made directly to the schools. In many instances the fund will pay for half of the school cost with the family paying the other half.
