

One of JFI's recipients: an orphanage in Sumatra

Just off the coast of Northern Sumatra lies the small island of Nias. One of its residents, Ibu Mastina, noticed orphans and children from poor families in her village who were unable to attend school because of financial limitations.

Feeling called to help these children, Ibu Mastina sold her five cows and half of her family's coconut farm to bring 20 children ranging from 6-16 years old to Medan, Indonesia. She rented a small home, registered the Bina Kasih Orphanage with the government, and began the difficult journey of supporting the children from the proceeds of the remaining half of her coconut farm. She also sought support from the community.

The home they rented happened to be on the same street as the local Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and within easy walking distance. After seeing the missionaries pass a few times, they asked if they could attend church there.

They began attending meetings and in the past year Ibu Mastina and many of the children have become active members of The Church. Since many of our returning senior and young missionaries are familiar with the orphanage and desire to help support it, the Jaredita Foundation has started accepting donations for this purpose.

Donations now made to the Jaredita Foundation will continue to support the educational needs of LDS students throughout Indonesia, but will also supply educational needs for the children at Bina Kasih Orphanage along with help with food, clothing and housing for the children.

Thanks to all of you who have already contributed to support this new expanded vision of the Jaredita Foundation as it continues to help children in Indonesia prepare for a brighter future.

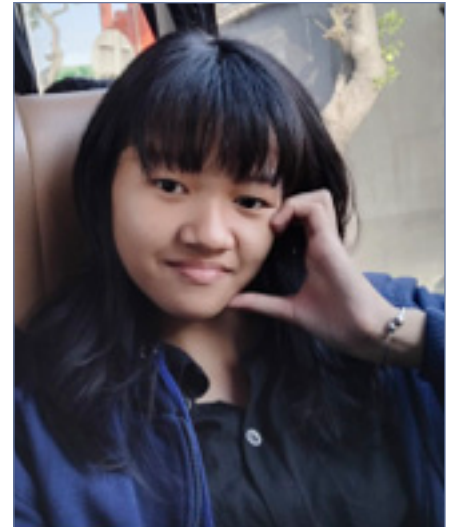

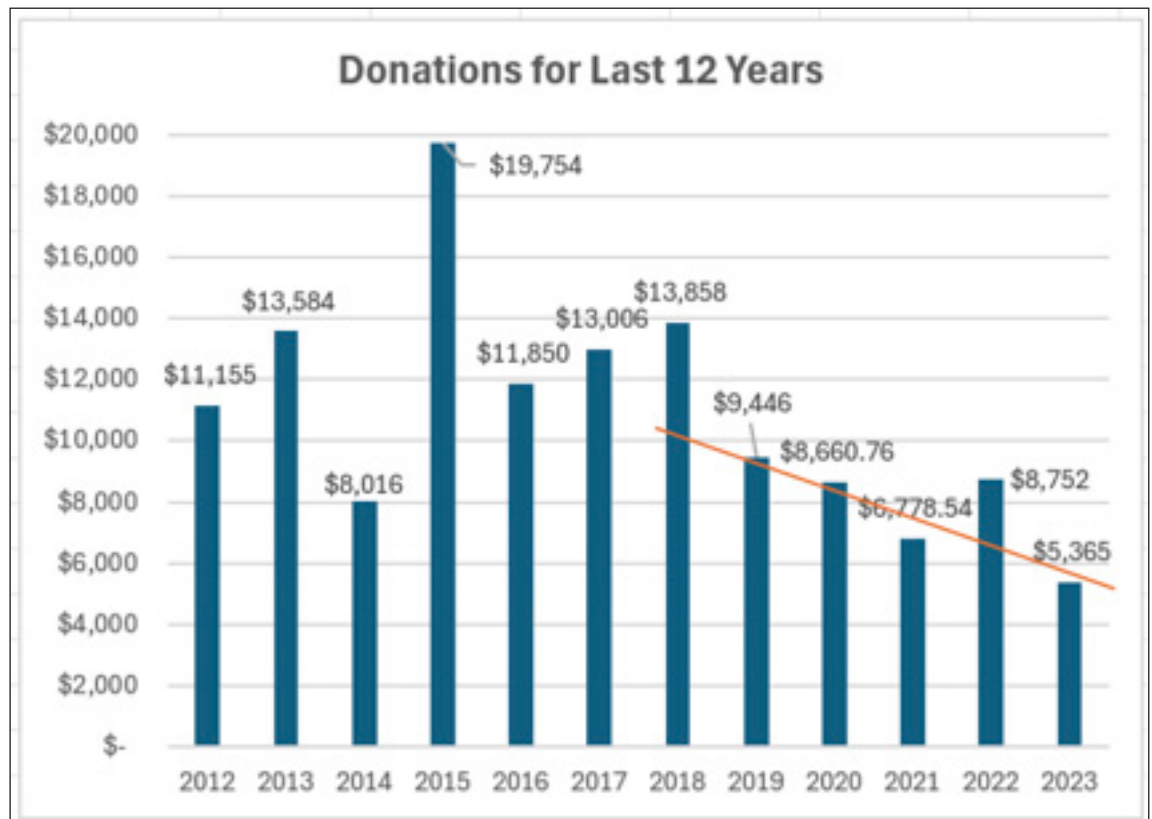

The graph above shows the donations received by JFI over the past 12 years. Note that in recent years donations have declined to a level well below our annual expenditure. The board of JFI will re-evaluate the financial condition of JFI at the end of 2024 and if the trend does not begin to recover, we will begin prioritizing the needs of applicants and start making difficult decisions about which cases to decline assistance. We will update our donors at that time.
